Documentation

TCR follows the author-date documentation system of the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 16th edition. Sources are briefly cited in the text, with full bibliographic information provided in a list of references. All notes should appear at the end of the article. Below are some examples of materials cited in this style, showing the format for in-text citation (T) and reference-list entry (R).

Book by one author
