The Cordillera Review (TCR) is an open-access internationally refereed electronic journal published biannually by the University of the Philippines Baguio through its research arm, the Cordillera Studies Center. It is a multidisciplinary journal devoted to the publication of both local and international studies on Philippine culture and society. Given the geographical location of the University of the Philippines Baguio in Northern Luzon, Philippines and its research thrust on Cordillera and indigenous studies, The Cordillera Review puts an emphasis on research about the Cordillera Region and other parts of Northern Luzon, Philippines. However, it encourages submission of national and global comparative studies and papers that contribute to the debate on theoretical and methodological approaches to the study of indigenous and upland societies such as in issues of:

- ethnicity, indigeneity and identity politics
- political economy of language, literature, media, and culture
- history and political dynamics
- socio-economic systems
- cultural policy, heritage and governance
- material culture
- environmental politics
- diasporic practices
- systems of representation
- artistic and intellectual traditions

Although it cannot accommodate scientific or empirical papers in the hard sciences, TCR welcomes articles on science and technology that illuminate issues and concerns in Philippine society especially in indigenous communities in the country and elsewhere in the world.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Articles must have a minimum of 7,000 words and must not exceed 12,000 words (word count does not include title, abstract, tables, figures, references, endnotes, acknowledgments, disclosures, and bionote).
- All manuscripts should be written with proper citations using the Author-Date documentation format of Chicago Manual of Style, 18th Edition. All explanatory notes should appear at the end of the manuscript.
- Manuscripts should be in MS Word format without any identifying information such as author(s) name and institutional affiliations. Author(s) must ensure that any identifying information in the manuscript are removed before submission.
- Articles may be submitted either in English or Filipino. These should be accompanied by an abstract of 150 – 250 words and five keywords. Abstracts for articles written in Filipino must have an English translation.
- Images, illustrations, figures and tables that are indispensable in the development of arguments in articles should be in high resolution (at least 300dpi) and must be sent as separate files, their placements properly indicated in the manuscript and appropriately captioned. If applicable, permission for use of copyrighted materials should be submitted.
- Authors should submit a biographical note of 100 words in a separate word file. This should include the author's latest educational attainment, a short description of current work or affiliation, and an email address.
- Authors should also submit a certification that their manuscript has not been published, and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. In addition, authors should disclose conflict of interest, if applicable, in a signed Declaration of Conflict of Interest.
- All files should be sent as email attachment (.docx for documents and .png for graphics) to the Editor-in-Chief (cordillerareview.upbaguio@up.edu.ph).
- Authors may only submit one article for consideration in every volume of the journal. Articles with substantially similar form or content with earlier submissions will not be accepted.
- TCR does not collect any submission, processing, or publication fees. Articles considered for publication are solely based on academic merit determined by the editors and peer reviewers.

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
